Eko Vidiyantho emphasized that this briefing event aims to provide a basic understanding of state governance and the role and function of PPPK. "As state

Socialization of Incoming Letters Through SRIKANDI Application

JAKARTA - The General Bureau of Lemhannas RI held a socialization of incoming letters through the SRIKANDI application on Tuesday (23/4) at Pancasila Room, Third Floor of Pancagatra Building, Lemhannas RI. The event aimed to measure the readiness of all work units in using the SRIKANDI and to study the obstacles that have arisen since its launch on April 1.

In his speech, the Coordinator of the Administration Division, Basirin, S.E., M.A., revealed several findings during the first two weeks of the SRIKANDI application. He emphasized the need for additional facilities and infrastructure in every work unit, such as laptops and computers. Basirin also mentioned that confidential letters can be processed without going through SRIKANDI. He emphasized the importance of submitting draft letters on working days, except

in urgent circumstances. He urged work units that have not submitted letters through this application to do so immediately and suggested conducting SRIKANDI technical guidance for echelon 1 and 2 officials.

Air First Marshal Wachid Alchamdani Z., Chief of the Telematics Bureau, stated that the SRIKANDI application is designed to simplify the administration of correspondence, especially when leaders are absent. He emphasized the importance of good communication and maximum use of this application.

Prime Secretary of Lemhannas RI, Police Commissioner General Drs. R.Z. Panca Putra S., M.Si., in his remarks, stated that this event is a follow-up to the implementation of the Electronic-Based Government System (SPBE) in Lemhannas RI, especially correspondence administration which has been started for sending letters. SPBE is a program of KemenPAN-RB aiming to help state apparatus carry out their duties more systematically and efficiently.

Panca Putra also emphasized that Lemhannas RI needs to develop a blueprint covering correspondence administration and ensuring the use of technology by all personnel in the work units. "Believe me, we will improve if we work sincerely to improve our services in Lemhannas," he said.

The event was then continued with the presentation of the incoming mail business map by Skilled Archivist, Marcellinus Mega Perwiratama, A.Md., the Administration Staff of General Affairs Bureau of Lemhannas RI.

Workshop on Bill Payment to Optimize State Budget Implementation

JAKARTA - The General Affairs
Bureau of Lemhannas RI held
a "Workshop on Bill Payment
Mechanism for the State Budget
Implementation in Lemhannas RI"
on Friday (26/4) at Pancasila Room,
Third Floor of Pancagatra Building,
Lemhannas RI. The General Bureau
Chief, Police Brigadier General Drs.
Wibowo, M.H., opened the workshop,
which was attended by Commitment
Making Officials (PPK) from all work
units in Lemhannas RI.

In his remarks, Wibowo hoped that the participants could comprehensively understand the technical payment mechanism so that it would contribute to more effective work in the future. Meanwhile, Colonel Cku Fajar Wibowo Supri Haryanto, M.Sc., the head of the finance division of the general affairs bureau, delivered a presentation on the bill payment mechanism within Lemhannas RI.

Fajar Wibowo began by explaining the importance of the Budget Implementation List (DIPA), which is the basis for implementing state expenditure after being authorized by the Minister of Finance. He emphasized that the allocation of funds in DIPA is the highest expenditure limit and should not be exceeded without sufficient funds.

Furthermore, implementing activities and using the budget on DIPA, which results in state expenditure, is carried out through commitment making (Binding). The commitment form is an agreement/contract for the procurement of goods/services in the





form of proof of purchase/payment, receipts, work orders, agreement letters, and order letters. Another form of commitment is stipulating decisions in decrees, orders, letters of assignment, statement letters, and official travel letters.

Furthermore, Fajar Wibowo explained that bills submitted to the state must be based on commitments and valid evidence to obtain payment, including work performance, list of payees, completion of tax obligations, and other requirements. Bill payment methods used include direct payment (LS) and supply money (UP), which consists of cash supply money and

supply money through Government Credit Cards (KKP).

Concluding the seminar, the Prime Secretary of Lemhannas RI, Police Commissioner General Drs. R.Z. Panca Putra, M.Si., emphasized the importance of mastering the budget absorption mechanism. He hoped this workshop would improve the governance and budget absorption in Lemhannas RI. "With better budget absorption, Lemhannas RI is expected to receive an award from the Director General of Budget of the Ministry of Finance," he concluded.



Lemhannas RI Ready to Support National Resilience Competence

JAKARTA - The Directorate of Study Development Program of the Deputy Office for Strategic Studies of Lemhannas RI discussed the "National Resilience Communication Forum" on Tuesday (30/4) at Kresna Room, Astagatra Building, Lemhannas RI. The forum was a follow-up to the National Resilience Communication Forum (Forkom) discussion on March 8.

In his report, the Director of the Study Development Program, Brigadier General Mohamad Rohadi, S.Sos, said that the discussion focused on accommodating the nomenclature of national resilience study programs in Higher Education (DIKTI) and opportunities for cooperation with Lemhannas RI for an independent university curriculum. This discussion was also held to encourage the empowerment of national resilience graduates.

The Communication Forum (Forkom) of National Resilience was opened directly by the Deputy for Strategic Studies, Prof. Dr. Ir. Reni Mayerni, M.P. It should be noted that in Indonesia, the development of national resilience studies is contained in several Higher Education institutions, such as at the University of Indonesia, Gadjah Mada University and has produced more than 2000 master and doctoral graduates in the field of national resilience science, including Andalas University and Hasanudin University which will soon establish a national resilience study program.

In her remarks, Reni Mayerni stated that the results of the National Resilience Communication Forum on March 8 had been followed up with a meeting with the DIKTI Quality Assurance Division at the

University of Indonesia. This event is expected to increase the national resilience algorithm.

Lemhannas RI also encourages the need for national resilience graduates to be accommodated in the formation of Civil Servant Candidates (CPNS) and State Civil Apparatus (ASN) so that graduates of national resilience studies are increasingly empowered. They can be included in the Indonesian National Work Competency Standard (SKKNI) to meet the HR needs of the State apparatus in Indonesia. "Through the national resilience forum, in the future, Lemhannas RI can strengthen national insight character as part of the independent curriculum and encourage national resilience competencies in strengthening the human resources of the state apparatus," she stated.

The discussion facilitated by Professional Expert Dr. Margaretha Hanita, S.H., M.Si., presented several speakers, namely Lecturer of the National Resilience Study Program at the University of Indonesia, Rear Admiral Dr. Ir. Abdul Rivai Ras. M.M., M.S., M.Si.; Head of BNN RI, Former Head of Densus 88, Lemhannas RI Education Alumni and National Resilience Master Alumni of University of Indonesia, Police Commissioner General Dr. Marthinus Hukom, M.Si.: Dean of the Faculty of Public Health of Hasanuddin University, Prof. Sukri Palutturi, SKM, M.Kes., MSc.PH, Ph.D., Director of PAM Jaya DKI Jakarta (Master Alumni of National Resilience), Mr. Arief Nasrudin, M.Si.; Professor of Andalas University, Prof. Nursyirwan Effendi, Dr.rer.soz.; and Professor Committee of the University of Indonesia, Prof. Dr. Lydia Freyani Hawadi.

Lemhannas RI Conducts Entry Meeting for External Peer Review



JAKARTA - Lemhannas RI conducted an Entry Meeting for External Peer Review on the Inspectorate of Lemhannas RI in 2024. This meeting was held on Monday (6/5) at Gatot Kaca Room, Third Floor of Astagatra Building, Lemhannas RI. It was opened directly by the Inspector of Lemhannas RI, Police Brigadier General Drs. Sunarwan Sumirat. This external peer review was conducted by the Inspectorate of the Ministry of Energy and Mineral Resources (ESDM) RI.

In his remarks, Sunarwan said that the Indonesian Financial and **Development Supervisory Agency** (BPKP) has assessed the capability of Lemhannas RI's Government Internal Supervisory Apparatus (APIP), which is currently at level 2 with a score of 2,290. One of the criteria that has not been met is the sustainable development and quality assurance of APIP through external

peer review, a vital element to achieve level 3 in the Internal Audit Capability Model (IA-CM).

Sunarwan explained that the Quality Assurance and Improvement Program (QAIP)'s objective is to ensure that internal supervision conforms to the definition and standards of internal supervision and applies the auditor's code of ethics. In addition, this program aims to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of internal control and identify opportunities for improvement.

"External peer review is a fundamental factor in maintaining and improving the quality and effectiveness of APIP internal control," Sunarwan said. This was the first time an external peer review had been conducted within Lemhannas, RI. Preparations that have been made included the peer review assessment process,

understanding of the assessment guidelines, preparation of required documents, implementation of questionnaires, and self-assessment according to quality assurance standards.

Associate Expert Auditor of the Technical Control Team of the Ministry of Energy and Mineral Resources RI, Riyanto Widodo, S.T., M.T., delivered a speech regarding the purpose of external peer review. This review aimed to assess the conformity of internal control practices with standards, the application of the auditor's code of ethics, the efficiency and effectiveness of internal control, and the fulfillment of stakeholder expectations. Riyanto also explained six principles of peer review: objectivity and conflictfree of interest, equality between the reviewing and reviewed APIP, openness to discussion and sharing of experience, professional skill, and care, focus on improving and increasing the effectiveness and quality of internal control, not on values, and peer review is not an audit to find mistakes.

The external peer review in Lemhannas RI was conducted from May 6 to May 30, 2024. Officials who attended the meeting included Inspector V Inspectorate General of the Ministry of Energy and Mineral Resources, Drs. Joko Suharyadi, M.Si. as the team leader; Associate Expert Auditor Jerry Alfiardy, S.T., M.T.; Associate Expert Auditor Kartika Sismiantari, S.T., M.T.; and other fellow officials. Sunarwan hoped that Lemhannas RI's APIP capability could be improved to level 3 through this peer review.

This event was opened by the Head of the Planning Bureau of the National Secretariat of Lemhannas RI, Admiral TNI Trismawan Djonisajoko, S.E., M.M., M.Tr.Opsla.

This activity was attended by Young Expert Budget Analysts from the Sub-directorate of Cost Standards, Directorate of Budgeting Systems, Directorate General of Budget, Ministry of Finance of the Republic of Indonesia, Tata Suharta, S.E., Ak., who acted as resource persons. In his presentation, Tata Suharta emphasized the importance of the Output Cost Standards policy in

supporting the cost standards that will be issued by all ministries and institutions. "Because we understand that we are in the public sector whose problem is that the money is not from our own business, but from state revenues from taxation," he said.

Tata Suharta explained that because the source of money comes from state revenues, public sector financial affairs focus more on expediency rather than profit. Output Cost Standards were created to ensure that the costs incurred by the government are commensurate with the benefits produced.

Furthermore, it is explained that output cost standards consist of two types: General Output Cost Standards (SBKU) which apply to several or all ministries/institutions, and Special Output Cost Standards (SBKK) which apply only to one ministry/institution. Tata Suharta also explains the benefits of output cost

standards which aim to improve the quality of planning, speed up the preparation and review of Ministry/ Agency Work Plans and Budgets (RKA-K/L), and facilitate the implementation of monitoring and evaluation in achieving output.

He added that proposals for output cost standards could come from the relevant ministries/institutions or from the Ministry of Finance through the Directorate General of Budget. "The ultimate goal is to achieve efficiency into quality shopping," stressed Tata Suharta. Quality shopping here does not mean costs that are too low, but how reasonable spending can produce maximum benefits.

This socialization is a step by Lemhannas RI to ensure that budgeting in the coming year is more efficient and accountable, in line with standard cost policies which aim to improve the quality of state spending for optimal public benefit. Fri

He added that proposals for output cost standards could come from the relevant ministries/institutions or from the Ministry of Finance through the Directorate General of Budget. "The ultimate goal is to achieve efficiency into quality shopping," stressed Tata Suharta. Quality shopping means reasonable spending which can produce maximum benefits.

This socialization is Lemhannas RI's effort to ensure more efficient and accountable budgeting in the coming year in line with standard cost policies which aim to improve the quality of state spending for optimal public benefit.
