

Collaboration Plan Between Lemhannas RI and ICRC

JAKARTA - Acting Governor of Lemhannas RI, Lieut. Gen. Eko Margiyono, received an audience from The Regional Delegation of the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) for Indonesia and Timor-Leste at the Governor's Executive Guest Room of Lemhannas RI on Thursday (4/7). The visit of the ICRC was led by the Head of ICRC for Indonesia and Timor Leste, Mr. Vincent Ochilet.

Eko Margiyono cordially welcomed the arrival of Mr. Vincent Ochilet and his group of delegates. Eko Margiyono explained the duties of Lemhannas RI, which include carrying out education for prospective national leaders, conducting strategic studies to provide input to the president, and organizing the strengthening of national values programs.

Panca Putra hopes that the participants will understand the importance of national values for the life of the nation and state and can convey them to all children of the nation, especially in the environment where they live and work.






Deputy Office for National Values Conducts Virtual Training

JAKARTA - Vice President of the Republic of Indonesia, Prof. Dr. (H.C.) K.H. Ma'ruf Amin, delivered a public lecture to 199 participants of the Regular Education Program (PPRA) 66 and 67 of Lemhannas RI at Aula Istana Wakil Presiden RI, Jakarta, on Wednesday (10/7). The event began with a brief report on the activities carried out by the PPRA 66 and 67 participants during their study in Lemhannas RI by the Acting Governor of Lemhannas RI, Lieut. Gen. Eko Margiyono.

Notary Must Hold Principles of the Four National Consensus

JAKARTA - Prime Secretary of Lemhannas RI, Commissioner General of Police Drs. R. Z. Panca Putra S., M.Si. spoke as the keynote speaker at the National Notary Workshop: Legal Aspects of Sharia Bank Financing Agreement Contracts and Drafting Sharia Financing Documents at Dwi Warna Purwa Room, Lemhannas RI on Friday (12/7). The workshop was part of the commemoration of the 116th anniversary of the Indonesian Notary Association (INI).

The Prime Secretary of Lemhannas RI emphasized that in Islamic banking, drafting notarial contract documents must refer to the fatwa issued by the MUI National Sharia Council. "The principle of prudence based on the understanding of sharia provisions and the integrity of the notary is necessary for producing a valid, authentic deed based on the contract of the parties," the Prime Secretary of Lemhannas RI stated. Therefore, all notaries need to have a complete understanding of every agreement and contract based on the MUI fatwa and applicable sharia principles.

According to the Prime Secretary of Lemhannas RI, the applied Sharia principles must uphold harmony, diversity, and tolerance among fellow human beings. Therefore, it is important for notaries to always uphold the principles of national insight based on the four basic consensuss of the nation and state. "Therefore, this workshop is very suitable and important as an effort to increase the capacity of notary officials to improve notary services," the Prime Secretary of Lemhannas RI concluded.







Strengthening of National Values for 2024 Paskibraka



CIBUBUR - Lemhannas RI conducted a strengthening of the National Values program derived from the Four National Basic Consensus of the nation for the Candidates of the 2024 Pusaka Flag Raising Troops (Paskibraka). The activity was held on July 15 to 21 at Wiladatika Park Cibubur, West Java.

"It is an obligation of Lemhannas RI to share and enlighten all of you on the strengthening of national values derived from the four basic consensus of the nation," the Acting Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. Eko Margiyono said when delivering his speech in front of 78 Paskibraka Candidates.

FGD on Mapping Indonesian Marine Potential to Achieve NZE Target





JAKARTA - The Directorate of **Economic and Natural Resources** Studies of Lemhannas RI held a Focus Group Discussion on a Long-Term Study entitled "Mapping the Potential of the Indonesian Ocean as a Carbon Sink to Achieve the Net Zero Emission (NZE) Target" at Kresna Room on Thursday (18/7). The event was chaired by the

Deputy for Strategic Studies, Prof. Dr. Ir. Reni Mayerni, M.P.

The Indonesian government has issued the Indonesian Blue Economy Roadmap as the main reference for developing the national blue economy until 2045. The primary targets are the percentage of Indonesia's Marine Environment that is designated

as a Marine Protected Area, the maritime sector's GDP contribution, and maritime employment. The mission is to safeguard healthy, resilient, and productive oceans, to promote environmentally friendly and sustainable economic growth, to boost human health, and to create a conducive environment.

Reni Mayerni pointed out that economic activities that have an impact on the health of blue carbon resources, including fisheries, land use, and transportation, must ensure the preservation of ecosystems that absorb and store carbon. "The downstream sector development also requires a regulatory and institutional framework that can support the participation of stakeholders who interact with the blue carbon ecosystem on a daily basis so that they can protect, empower, and actively manage the blue carbon ecosystem," she said.

The discussion presented several speakers, including the Executive **Expert of Marine and Coastal** Ecosystem Management of the Ministry of Marine Affairs and Fisheries, Ir. Andi Rusandi, M.Si; Head of the Community, Institutional and Policy Development Program Division of the Bogor Agricultural University, Dr. M. Arsyad Al Amin, M.Si; Head of the Environmental Fund Management Agency of the Ministry of Finance, Dr. Joko Tri Haryanto, S.E., M.S.E; Program Director of the Indonesia Ocean Justice Initiative, Stephanie Juwana, S.H., LL.M; and Plastic Waste and Ocean Manager of the World Resource Institute Rocky, Pairunan.

JAKARTA - "Making maps for the IKN, the most ideal data is aerial photography because of its detailed scale," Head of the Geospatial Information Agency (BIG) Prof. Dr. rer.nat. Muh Aris Marfai, S.Si., M.Sc stated when giving a lecture to PPRA 67 participants at the Bhinneka Tunggal Ika Room on Thursday, July 18, 2024.

Delivering a lecture on "One Map Policy in Supporting Sustainable Development of IKN," the Head of BIG explained the implementation of geospatial information, the implementation and utilization of one map policy, and geospatial information for the development of IKN.

Geospatial information for IKN development produces data that can help analyze various things and potential problems to formulate programs to overcome them. For example, there is an overlap of HGU and mining permits in forest areas. In addressing this, cross-sectoral synergies can be used.

As noted, there are several strategic issues in the construction of IKN. including strategic location, land availability, government support for the land provision process, a new epicenter as a new economic node for equitable development, and adequate infrastructure development. However, these strategic issues come with challenges such as environmental degradation, social issues such as food security, environmental issues such as post-mining recovery, and sustainability issues.

Therefore, it is necessary to establish cross-sectoral synergies in utilization of geospatial

information. Some of the synergies that have been performed included the Ministry of ATRBPN analyzing and determining the plan; the IKN Authority involving BIG in the process of analyzing the delineation of the IKN Urban Area Section; and BIG preparing technical guidelines

for land capability units in terms of supporting the process of determining the spatial pattern plan map. Therefore, it is safe to say that the utilization of geospatial information requires cross-sectoral synergy.





Health Minister: Healthy Society, Developed Country

JAKARTA - "We are rich in natural resources, we have proper infrastructures, if the people aren't healthy, we can't become a developed country," Health Minister Budi Gunadi Sadikin said. This was conveyed when providing Strengthening National Values for the Bandung Institute of Technology Alumni Association (IA-ITB); Smandel Business Network (SBN); Indonesia Financial Group (IFG); and BPJS Ketenagakerjaan on Tuesday (24/7).

The Health Minister explained that health transformation is one of the steps that needs to be taken to make Indonesia a developed country. In doing so, health strategies must change. A shift must be created from treating sick people to keeping

people healthy starting from managing the Community Health Center to hospital level, focus on doctors, cadres, and midwives, supervise surgical equipment and medicines, and promoting immunization and screening. "What is being taken care of is not only curative, but preventive," Health Minister concluded.

Health Minister further said that to bring Indonesia as developed country into reality, its people healthy and productivity must be maintained. When its people are not healthy will, productivity will decrease. "If we want a developed country, we have to make our children and families healthy," the Health Minister of Health. According to him, the task

of the younger generation in taking Indonesia to leap further will be even more difficult in the future. Therefore, the transformation of Indonesia's health system is an obligation.

The health transformation carried out covers several areas, including transformation of primary services, transformation of referral services, transformation of the health resilience system, transformation of the health financing system, transformation of health human resources, and transformation of health technology. It is hoped that the various steps taken will realize health transformation to support Indonesia to become a developed country.

JAKARTA - Acting Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut, Gen. Eko Margiyono attended the Submission of the Audit Result Report (LHP) on the 2023 Ministry/Agency Financial Report (LKKL) on Thursday (25/7). Located in the Auditorium of the Indonesian Financial Audit Agency (BPK RI), Eko Margiyono directly received the LHP for the 2023 LKKL with an Unqualified Opinion (WTP) submitted by Member I of the BPK as Head of the State Financial Audit I Nyoman Adhi Suryadnyana, S.E., M.E., CSFA., CertDA., CGCAE., GRCE., CFrA., CIISA., CFA., ChFA. Lemhannas RI succeeded in achieving Unqualified Opinion nine years in a row since 2015.

Nyoman Adhi expressed his appreciation and gratitude to the leaders of Ministries/Institutions who have shown their seriousness in implementing state financial management in an accountable and transparent manner. On this occasion, Nyoman Adhi said that in preparing the strategic plan, it must be in accordance with the things that are stated in order to achieve the vision of a Golden Indonesia 2045 which is based on four pillars, namely human development and mastery of science and technology, sustainable economic development, and equality.

Nyoman Adhi also said that unqualified opinions increase public trust and improve stakeholder ratings and reputation. In addition, unqualified opinion encourages improvements in good governance to support the achievement of the entity's vision and mission and is a representation of good financial governance.

JAKARTA - Coordinating Minister for Human Development and Culture (Menko PMK) Prof. Dr. Muhadjir Effendy, M.A.P. had the opportunity to give a public lecture to PPRA 66 & 67 participants at the Gadjah Mada Auditorium, on Tuesday (30/7).

"To realize a golden Indonesia 2045, improving the quality of human resources plays an important role," Muhadjir Effendy said. In terms of human development, the government has intervened from an early age, starting from prenatal by intervening in maternal nutrition so that children are born healthy until early childhood, teenagers, adults and elderly.

Furthermore, through Presidential Instruction Number 4 of 2022

concerning accelerating the ending of extreme poverty, the government continues to strive to resolve the poverty rate of the population. Muhadjir Effendy also explained that the government's efforts include nutritional interventions to prevent stunting from the prenatal period, as well as interventions to simultaneously measure babies and toddlers as stunting prevention effort throughout Indonesia. In addition, the government is trying to improve human resources by providing high quality vocational and higher education to prepare young generation in working environment in the future.

The minister further said that the obstacles in Indonesia's human development today are the fast flow of information and the emergence of "post truth" in society. In line with this, Muhadjir Effendy hopes that all PPRA 66 and 67 participants who sit as officials, practitioners and experts in their fields can become the main pillars in protecting the Indonesian generation from post truth and welcoming an advanced Indonesia. "We all hope that the dream of becoming a developed country is also in line with the realization of healthy, intelligent human resources who have noble character." he concluded.







Deputy Head of BPIP Hopes Participants Can Build the 2045 Golden Generation

JAKARTA - Deputy Head of the Indonesian Pancasila Ideology Development Agency (BPIP) Dr. Rima Agristina, S.H., S.E., M.M. had the opportunity to give a lecture to PPRA 67 Lemhanas RI participants in the Bhinneka Tunggal Ika Room, Lemhannas RI, on Thursday (1/8). On this occasion, Rima delivered her presentation entitled "Global Ideology and Its Influence on National and State Life".

Delivered by Rima Agristina, Indonesia made its goal or vision to become an independent, united, sovereign, just and prosperous country. The mission to achieve this goal is to protect all the people of
