First Plenary Session of JGF VIII/2024: Geopolitics and Maritime Whole of Government in the Region

JAKARTA - The Jakarta Geopolitical Forum (JGF) VIII/2024 on "Addressing Geo-Maritime Resilience Challenges in the Indo-Pacific" took place at the Ritz-Carlton Hotel, Kuningan, Jakarta on (25/9). The two-day forum brought together leaders and experts from several countries to discuss maritime resilience challenges in the geomaritime tension-ridden Indo-Pacific region.

The first plenary session hosted by Dr. R.A. Adriani Kusumawardani, Director for Maritime Security and Resilience of the Coordinating Ministry for Maritime Affairs and Investment, covered the topic of "Geopolitics and Maritime Whole of Government in the Region". The discussion proceeded with opening remarks by the General TNI (Ret.) Luhut Binsar Pandjaitan, the Coordinating Minister for Maritime Affairs and Investment of the Republic of Indonesia. The discussion was followed by the keynote speech by the Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Indonesia, Pahala Nugraha Mansury, S.E., M.B.A., emphasizing the need for stronger international cooperation in dealing with threats and crimes at sea. Both speakers highlighted the importance of regional and global collaboration in strengthening maritime security.

Stéphane Mechati, Chargé d'affaires of the European Union delegation to Indonesia, discussed the implementation of the whole-ofgovernment approach in the Indo-Pacific region and the role of major players in the region's geopolitics. In addition, Dr. Kao Kim Hourn, the Secretary-General of ASEAN, talked about ASEAN's perspective on implementing the whole-ofgovernment approach in addressing maritime issues. He pointed out ASEAN's role in applying this approach to strengthen maritime resilience in the region.

Melissa Conley Tyler, the Executive Director of the Asia-Pacific Development, Diplomacy, and Defence Dialogue, discussed the geopolitical position of middlepower nations and their contribution to implementing the whole-ofgovernment approach. Tyler emphasized how these countries can support collective efforts in countering maritime threats.

Second Plenary Session of JGF VIII/2024: Strategic Partnership for Sustainable Maritime Industry

JAKARTA - In a series of Jakarta Geopolitical Forum (JGF) VIII/2024 with a theme "Addressing Geo-Maritime Resilience Challenges in the Indo-Pacific," the second plenary session focused on "Strategic Partnership for Sustainable Maritime Industry," which took place at the Ritz-Carlton Hotel, Kuningan, Jakarta on (25/9). The discussion was hosted by Radian Nurcahyo of the Coordinating Ministry for Maritime Affairs and Investment.

The session began with a keynote speech by Prof. Wihana Kirana Jaya, Special Staff of the Indonesian Ministry of Transportation. In it, Prof. Wihana discussed the importance of strategic partnerships in advancing a sustainable maritime industry and

emphasized regional and global cooperation as key to addressing maritime security and sustainability challenges in the Indo-Pacific region, especially in Indonesia.

The first speaker, Dr. Martin Inglott, the Director of Crimario Project, spotlighted The Indo-Pacific Regional Information Sharing (IORIS) solutions in dealing with maritime security threats and safety challenges, as well as how IORIS facilitates partnership building between flag and port states and the maritime industry in the Indo-Pacific. Following this, Muhamad Resa, the Risk Management Director of Pertamina International Shipping, elaborated on the significant disruptions affecting the maritime industry and their impact on social, economic, and operational issues, as well as the disruptive sustainability impacts on the regional maritime industry and their mitigation strategies.

Jakub Similski, Business Development Manager at Scytalys EFA Group, discussed the latest technology developments and implementations in the maritime industry and the role of technology in supporting a sustainable maritime industry. Finally, Rene Piil Pedersen, Managing Director of A.P. Moller Singapore Pte Ltd (Maersk Line Singapore), explained how multinational companies in the maritime industry are adopting sustainable shipping practices to support ecological, human, and economic health and vitality.



Third Plenary Session of JGF VIII/2024: Maritime Security and Challenges in the Region





JAKARTA - Entering the second day, the Jakarta Geopolitical Forum (JGF) VIII/2024 held the third plenary session with the topic "Maritime Security and Challenges in the Region". The discussion was hosted by a Senior Lecturer of the

Department of International Relations of the University of Indonesia, Edy Prasetyono, Ph.D.

Indonesia's Deputy Minister of Defense, Lieutenant General TNI (Ret.) Muhammad Herindra,

M.A., M.Sc., started the session by emphasizing the importance of enhancing defense cooperation and maritime security in the Indo-Pacific region. He stressed that maritime stability is key to the process of peace and shared prosperity, given the strategic position of the Indo-Pacific as an important global trade

The discussion was followed by Sandeep Chakravorty, Ambassador of India to Indonesia, emphasizing how India views the geopolitical importance of the Indo-Pacific region and outlining India's key maritime interests. He also expressed India's vision of promoting a rules-based order in the region, as well as the key principles that should guide regional cooperation. Then, Admiral Vladimir Vorobev, Deputy Commander of the Russian Navy, explored the impact of Russia's latest maritime doctrine on regional maritime security and resilience and Russia's position and perspective on maintaining order in an increasingly complex and multidimensional sea.

Indonesia's Deputy Chief of Naval Staff, Rear Admiral Erwin S. Aldedharma, S.E., M.M., M.Sc., spoke on Indonesia's Global Maritime Axis and its Perspective on Good Ocean Governance. Aldedharma described how Indonesia's Global Maritime Axis policy affects regional maritime security and Indonesia's perspective on maintaining order at sea.





Fourth Plenary Session of Jakarta Geopolitical Forum VIII/2024: Projecting Future Challenges In Maritime Security

JAKARTA - Jakarta Geopolitical
Forum VIII/2024 continued the
second day's agenda with the fourth
plenary session which focused
on "Projecting Future Challenges
in Maritime Security" at the RitzCarlton Hotel, Kuningan, Jakarta.
This session was moderated by Dr.
Shafiah F. Muhibat, Deputy Executive
Director of the Research Center for
Strategic and International Studies
(CSIS), who expertly directed the
discussion between the speakers and
participants.

The session opened with a speech from the Deputy Chair of the National Research and Innovation Agency (BRIN), Prof. Dr. Ir. Amarulla Octavian, S.T., M.Sc., DESD., ASEAN Eng, , who underlined the importance of

research and innovation in dealing with increasingly complex maritime security challenges.

The first speaker, Erik van der Veen, Head of Program Office in Indonesia for the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) explained future trends in maritime transnational crime and its impact on criminal justice practices. He emphasized the importance of stronger regional cooperation to overcome the threat of transnational maritime crime. Then Masayoshi Mita from the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC), spoke about "Adoption of Sustainable Practices in the Maritime Industry". Mita explains how multinational companies in the maritime industry are adopting

sustainable shipping practices to support ecological, human and economic health, as well as the development of green technologies in the maritime industry.

Australian National Center for Ocean
Resources and Security (ANCORS),
University of Wollongong, discussed
"Challenges of Future Maritime
Security Cooperation." Shrikhande

achieve resilience to strategic risk
and disruption.

In closing, Eko Margiyono hopes to see collaboration and sustainable progress that will emerge from discussions at the JGF Forum. "I hope everyone gets inspiration from these discussions, and until we meet again," he concluded.
